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

SEMINAR ON EDUCATIONAL REFORM STRATEGIES

A seminar on "Educational Reform Strategies" was held on November 16, 2013 at the Surawong campus of STIC. It was attended by the students, alumni and lecturers of

the Master of Education (M.Ed) program. The guest speaker was Dr. Sunny Gabinete, Dean of the Faculty of Teacher Education, St. Paul University, Philippines. The focus of the seminar was the implementation of the K-12 program by the Philippine Department of Education which entails the institutionalization of kindergarten and the addition of two (2) or more years of high school in the basic education cycle. It should be noted that in comparison with other ASEAN





countries, the Philippines stands out as one that offers only ten (10) years of basic education.

Hence, the introduction of the K-12 program constitutes a massive reform in the educational system in the country.

The core content of the new K-12 curriculum includes communication and literacies; critical thinking and problem solving; creativity and innovation; ethical, moral and spiritual values; life and career competencies; development of self and sense of community; and national and global orientedness. The pedagogical approaches are constructivist, inquiry- based, integrative, collaborative and reflective. The main features are: it is value laden, inquiry-based, flexible, integrative, inclusive, lean but meaty as well as decongested and enriched. The guiding principles behind the new curriculum are: outcomes, standard-based; learner- centered; seamless; developmentally appropriate;



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constructivist; comprehensive and systematic monitoring and evaluation system and balanced assessment.

With the implementation of this new educational reform, the Department of Education projects that an enhanced curriculum will decongest academic workload, giving students more time to master competencies and time for extra-curricular activities, thus allowing for their more holistic development.



At the end of the seminar, the participants were given evaluation forms to gauge their reaction. The result of the evaluation showed that the participants, as a whole, rated the content

and presentation as "highly appropriate", the materials "very useful", the speaker "excellent", and the topic "highly relevant." The over- all evaluation of the seminar was "Excellent".

Preparations for opening the new course in Air Traffic Control

Dr Theresa Virachanee Promsuntom, the Vice Chairperson and Mr Suwat Benjatammatorn the Vice President for Administrative Affairs at ST Theresa International College and the management team recently met with a working group to prepare a new field of study; namely a Bachelor of Science degree in Air Traffic Control, which is to be offered in the Academic Year 2014.
