Training course on Basic Life Supports

The Faculty of Public Health's training course on BLS gets underway



The lecturers of Faculty of Public Health organized a training course on Basic Life Supports for the Faculty students on September 26, 2014 at Exhibition Room of Joseph Marie Auditorium.

Basic life support (BLS) is the level of medical care which is used for victims of life-threatening illnesses or injuries until they can be given full medical care at a hospital. It can be provided by trained medical personnel, including emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and by laypersons who have received BLS training.



BLS is generally used in the pre-hospital setting, and can be provided without medical equipment.

BLS for Pre-hospital Providers: A combination of online and in-classroom training improves the learning experience and provides greater flexibility for students and Instructors, while still delivering hands-on instruction that enhances performance and improves outcomes in the field.
