Ms. Pattarawadee Sribud, nickname Aun Aun, is a 22 years old 4th year student in Airlines Business at St Theresa International College and she hopes her dream will come true.

When she graduates in the near future she hopes to be an Air hostess.

She is now on an internship program with Swiss Airlines, a branch of Lufthansa Airlines, at Suvanabhumi International Airport. The program lasts for four months, from October 27, 2014 to February 28, 2015.



In Ms. Pattarawadee's own words she says "So far, so good. It's okay for me now to work with all flight documentations of the crew signs and manifests of all crew and passengers for both arrival and departure or before the airline landing and taking off,"



Normally I work from 8 a.m. -2 p.m. but it's really busy from 10 a.m. -1.00 p.m. After that I have lunch at 3 p.m. As I have to prepare all the documents, spending about 10 minutes to summarize a document or report,

- "During the assignments, I think I can get along with my mentors who are the senior staff like the flight managers of the airline for working on checking in, boarding pass service, taking care of passenger boarding services. I really like to work here as part of the airline ground staff,
- "We also have a Smiley service program for taking care of the VIP passengers. We are working as the VIP assistants. I like this career and work happily here. I wake up at 4 a.m. and arrive at the airport around 7 a.m. Currently, I know everything necessary for all document duty before the flight departures or landings,



"During my internship, I also have a colleague who is an intern in Airline Business from Cha-am Rajabhat University, Prachuab Khirikhan province. For me, I am proud of coming from St Theresa International College as we are outstanding in using English language, dress smartly, have good personality, and are well spoken. We also have been tested for the knowledge on airline profession, such as airline business, ticketing system and so on which we are proud of being the good representative here,"

"We are really taught at using the English language with a good personality and grooming," she remarked with a smile.

From the past experiences, " We have learned that the

interns did not follow the rules, regulations and disciplines which was our weak point. They were overconfident. Some of them were sometimes absent and came late for work.

"Therefore, at this time of our internship, we have to remove the weak points," she noted.

A little about Pattarawadee A's background.

Her father was from Buriram province in the Northeastern region. He operates a car garage and service business in Samut Prakan province, while her mother from Mahasarakam province also in the Esarn region is now the Esarn food vendor in the Bang Phli areas, Samut Prakan. Ms. Pattarawadee has a younger sister who is now studying in the Mathayomsueksa 2 Class of Bang Phli Rajbamrung School, the same school as Aun Aun graduated with a GPA of 3.60

Nowadays, her parents hope that Aun Aun will graduate the BA degree in Airline Business and get the job.



Aun Aun has a great talent in singing, especially in Thai Look Tung songs. She goes everywhere for the singing contests until in 2009, she succeeded when she won the singing contest organized by the schools under the Ministry of Education. That year she received the winning trophy of Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Siridhorn by singing the song named "*Princess (Maha Chakri Sirindhorn) Song Boon*" originally song by Cathereeya Malasri, one of the country's most popular Look Tung singers,

"When I get the job and then I can earn some money which I will pay back for the Student Loan/ as I still have a debt with the College," she promised.

Aun Aun also said she would like to tell the young generation to come here for studying because the College has the most outstanding characteristics and strength, it's good grade curriculum / program / course subject that are offered by the College with professional teachers/ lecturers with competencies,

"They should love the College, much more and more," she asked for, adding that St Theresa International is the educational institute that can produce the highly-qualified graduates in this Airline field, when compared to others," she concluded.
