Since Russia's invasion of Ukraine on 24 February, 2022, there have been no signs of stopping up until now. It's not surprising that the war between these two countries can have effects on many other countries around the world whether directly or indirectly. According to sources, Russia is ranked 12th as the country with the biggest economy in the world, or 1.75% of the

Europe use natural gas to produce electricity, especially Germany, which uses up to 20% of oil in electricity production. Even though many countries are observing the war with caution and pray for the war to end, unfortunately, the war between Russia and Ukraine is unlikely to finish soon. 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MONKEY POX, ANOTHER WORLDWIDE THREAT???

As counted, there have been 26,208 confirmed Monkey Pox cases worldwide, with 83 more confirmed cases mostly in Europe. As stated, the top five countries with the highest number of cases solved the

Monkey pox symptoms include having a fever for about 2-4 weeks. The incubation period for monkeypox is 7-21 days. Symptoms are divided into 2 stages.

The pre-rash phase is approximately

On August 5, 2022, the 4th confirmed case of monkey pox in Thailand was reported. She's identified as a 22-year-old Thai woman with a history of going to a corporate institution in Bangkok area where foreigners visit regularly which had put her at risk.
