FUTURE PILOTS BAC STUDY VISIT

On July 1st, 2022, the Year I, II & III students along with Ajarn Praveen Shaju and Ajarn Hariramakrishnan visited the Bangkok Aviation Centre Flight School for a study tour. BAC is a fully accredited flight school, under well-experienced certified flight instructors and technicians to train future pilots and ground crew members. It has Cessna 172R and Diamond 42 flight simulators with a hanger. So, it became the perfect choice for a study visit by the Aeronautics students. The functions of aircraft control surfaces, navigation, communication, aircraft systems, and instruments, as well as aircraft maintenance and airside operations, were well-exposed to and practiced by the students. Students were able to correlate their classroom learning with the real-world experience to understand the functions of the aircraft. This visit helped to enhance their moral and ethics, practical knowledge, and interpersonal skills.
