








NEW BUILDING AND LABORATORY UNIFORM FOR NURSING SCIENCE STUDENTS

International University Teresa upgraded (TRSU) recently facilities, with the nursing student laboratory remodeled in Residence Hall Number 1. Each section now has a dedicated lab space equipped with training dummies to enhance practical students' learning experience.

Nursing students are required to wear three different uniforms: a general ward nursing uniform, a scrub suit for the intensive care unit (ICU) or operating room (OR), and a community nursing uniform for oncall duties. Starting this year, second -year students will have a new scrub suit. The previous design was modified because the collar was too wide, making it uncomfortable, especially for female students when sitting or performing tasks. The new design features a narrower collar to


