On 28th of January 2020, it was announced that we received 8th place in the 1st round of the video campaign contest. It meant that we were qualified for the 2nd round!

Then on 5th of February, we went to The 9th Tower Grand Rama IX again to identify a place where we should volunteer and help. We were assigned to Nhong Sai Village in Kanchanaburi Province to promote the topic “Health”.

We started this project on 7th February with the assistance of Mr. Phuripat (Student Affairs Office). He contacted Ms. Supaporn and Mrs. Kingkaew (Faculty of Nursing Science lecturers) and requested for their help and cooperation. We named our project ‘Ban Nong Sai Ruam Jai Huang Yai Suk Kha Parb’ (Nong Sai Village Unite Together and Be Healthy).

We planned out 4 exercise activities:

How to Laugh for Good Health

How to Use Gestures to prevent Alzheimer or Dystopia

Thai Traditional Dance with Loincloth to prevent Arthritis

CPR and Refer Patient System with Line ‘Code Blue’ Application

The target group of this project is adults aged 50-80 years old.

Suddenly on 15th of March, the organizer told us that Ban Nong Sai villager was infected with COVID-19 so they offered us to change the location to Wat Khwang Village, Phitsanulok. We only had 4 days to change the plan, adjust all the activities, and revise our poster. A major concern we had was that the distance from Nakhon Nayok to Phitsanulok is farther away than Nakhon Nayok to Kanchanaburi so we had to make lots of changes in completing the whole campaign though we had a very limited time and resources.

On 19th of March, the whole team went to Wat Khwang Village, Phitsanulok to facilitate our campaign in promoting healthy lifestyles to the villagers. Staying with them was certainly a good experience. Most villagers there are elderly farmers. They’re very friendly, generous and very active in doing the activities.

I am so proud of myself that we can partake in the volunteering activities. Fortunately, we received the highest achievement on this contest which added another achievement to our beloved college.

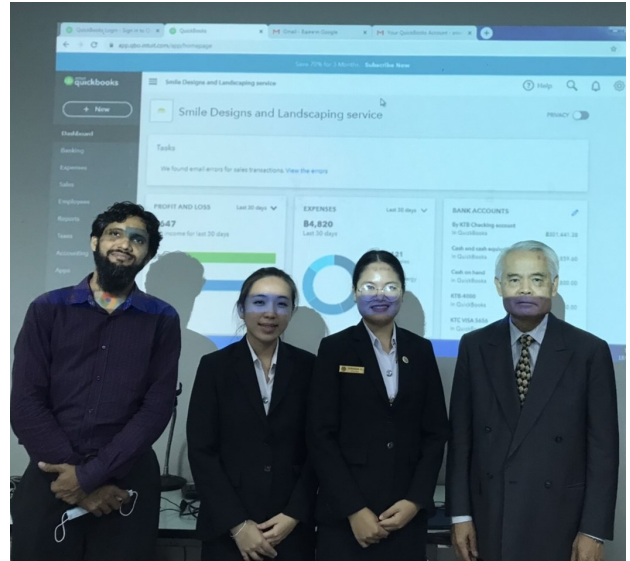
LEARN THE ESSENTIALS OF DIGITAL ACCOUNTING SOFTWARE!!

The course includes lessons on recording day to day business transactions, managing payroll, accounts payable, accounts receivable, inventory and invoicing.

QuickBooks or Xero are leading digital accounting applications. These accounting programs are used by many small and medium businesses to manage day to day business activities, payroll, inventory and expenses reports. After completing St. Theresa International College's Accounting Software course, students will demonstrate their mastery on these popular digital accounting applications. The in-demand skills developed in this course will help the students stand out to employers looking for accountants and payroll administrators. Moreover, students will be able to work as a freelance accountant in UPWork freelancing site or as a remote bookkeeper/accountant.
