innovations in various fields.

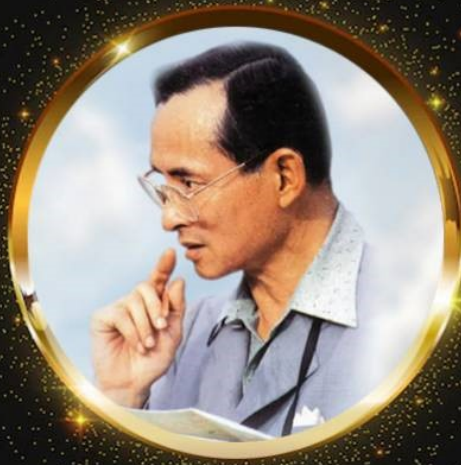

STAMPEDE IN SOUTH KOREA ON HALLOWEEN

Halloween celebration in South Korea turns deadly as 151 died and more than 140 were injured. The majority of the deceased were young adults, and 26 foreigners from 14 different nations. This happened on a Sunday night when many people have gathered and united to participate in the Halloween festivities. The 'supposed to be fun activity' didn't turn out as the way people expected it to be. The huge crowd had become drastically unruly as the evening went on. No one had clues that these celebration-goers were about to experience the most traumatic event that will put the lives of many on the brink of death adding up the record as one of the deadliest peacetime accidents that happened in the recent history of South Korea.

The police officers have claimed that

even before the stampede incident they already had troubles of maintaining control of the crowd. But what really was the real cause of this tragic event? Unfortunately, what triggered the crowd surge was still unclear. Some local media reports claimed a huge number of people flocked to the area after knowing that an unnamed celebrity had been there. A survivor said, "As people in the front fell over, those in the back were crushed." Witnesses also reported that they have seen people losing their footing on the slope and crowds pushing in various directions, which led to a domino effect. A visiting professor of crowd science named G. Keith Still claimed that crushing is not the attributed cause of death, but suffocation.

This tragic event will forever leave a grieving mark on everyone's heart. I cannot fathom the pain they have endured as they suffocate in the midst of the huge crowd. They were expecting to have an enjoyable night without having in mind that danger awaits and lurks in the crowd. We cannot change what has already happened and all we can do is to pray for those families who were in great loss from the tragic incident. It somehow dawned on me that we really cannot tell when our last day on earth is, but it does not mean that we have to live carelessly just to have fun. We must still treasure our lives and be cautious while living it up. We have to be critical in thinking about the possible outcome in every decision we make because who knows, what you expect to be fun might eventually cost your life.

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KIDS AT A NURSERY'S MISFORTUNE

On October 11, 2022, the news about a gun and knife attack at a daycare center in north-east Thailand has alarmed not only the people of Thailand, but the whole world as well. The suspect was an ex-policeman who killed at least 37 people, most of whom were very young children. In the wake of the incident in Nong Bua Lamphu Province, police claimed that assailant later killed himself and his family after the mass murder.

Police said that the attacker's weapon was a 9 mm pistol that had been obtained legally. According to the police, the perpetrator stabbed most

of his victims before running away. The 34-year-old ex-officer was fired from his position in June over drug use, according to authorities. If the attack had a purpose, it's still unclear.

The horrific murder in the town of Utthai Sawan left at least 23 youngsters dead. In their sleep, some victims as young as two years old were attacked. Just over 20 students attended school on Thursday due to poor weather and a broken-down school bus, according to Ms. Panchum, the head teacher, who stated there are often more than 90 students present.

In conclusion, this is a horrifying incident not only to the people present in the mass murder but also to the people who were there to witness and lost a loved one in the mass slaughter. As a student this incident is difficult to take into consideration as it gives us the realization that no one in this world is really safe as even kids as young as 3 years old are being massacred by a heartless individual. How much more us teens? Which is why we should always take into consideration our safety at all times, especially when we are going out alone.
