## AR'S STUDY VISIT TO BANGKOK FLIGHT SERVICES CARGO

On the 7th of September, Aeronautics students from all year levels, accompanied by Ajarn Praveen Shaju, the Head of the Program, visited the Bangkok Flight Services Cargo Warehouse located at Suvarnabhumi Airport premises as part of the teaching-learning process. The primary objective of this visit was to gain firsthand knowledge of air cargo logistics, operations, and the role of air cargo warehouses in the global supply chain.

Bangkok Flight Services is a joint venture between Worldwide Flight Services, the world's largest independent ground handler with over 20 years of global experience,

and Bangkok Airways, the second-largest regional scheduled carrier in Thailand, known as Asia's Boutique Airline. Bangkok Flight Services (BFS) is a modern, innovative, and customer-focused ground handling company offering full passenger, ramp, and cargo handling services at Bangkok Suvarnabhumi Airport.

During the visit, students gained insights into various aspects, including the cargo handling process, the importance of real-time inventory management for tracking the location and status of cargo, procedures for customs clearance, and accurate documentation ensuring smooth international shipments.

They also learned about security measures in place to prevent unauthorized access to cargo, safety protocols to prevent accidents and damage, various regulations and standards governing air cargo operations, and the utilization of advanced technology and automation in cargo handling.

Overall, the study visit to the air cargo warehouse provided a valuable learning experience, allowing students to bridge the gap between classroom knowledge and real-world practices in the air cargo industry.
