TRSU STUDENTS EXPLORE THAI HANDICRAFTS AT THE 15TH SIAM IDENTITY EVENT

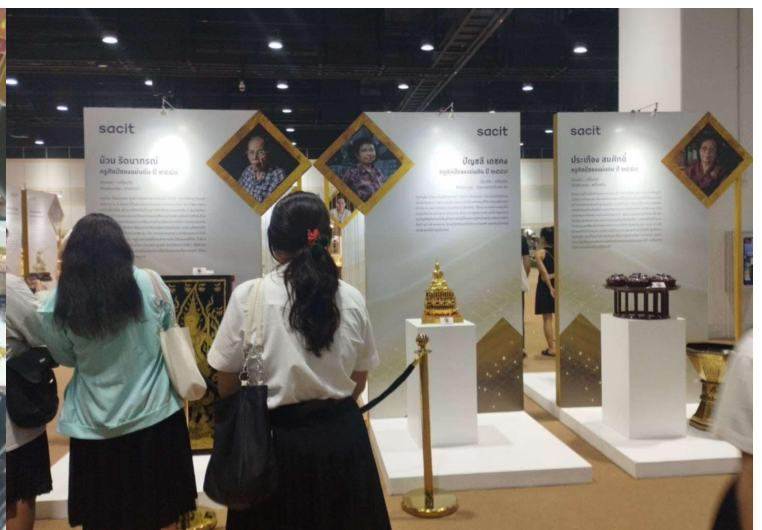
