THAILAND REJOICES AS OPAL SUCHATA CHUANGSRI CROWNED MISS WORLD 2025

Capturing the crown and the hear Jubilation swept across the nation on May 31 as Thailand celebrated a historic moment in global pageantry. Opal Suchata Chuangsri etched her name in the record books by becoming the first-ever Thai woman to win the coveted Miss World crown, a moment that ignited national pride and admiration.

Hailing from Phuket province, the 21-year-old beauty queen and scholar captivated the international stage in Hyderabad, India, triumphing over contestants from around the globe to claim the Miss World 2025 title.

She also became the second Southeast Asian to win the crown, solidifying her status as a rising icon not only in beauty and grace but also in intellect and advocacy.

Born on September 20, 2003, Suchata grew up in a business-oriented family in Thalang, Phuket. Her parents, Thanet Donkamnerd and Supatra Chuangsri, run a private enterprise, fostering in her a sense of discipline and ambition from an early age. She began her education at Kajonkietsuksa School before completing her upper secondary

studies at the prestigious Triam Udom Suksa School, majoring in Chinese under the Arts program. Continuing her academic journey, she enrolled at Thammasat University, pursuing a degree in politics and international relations at the Faculty of Political Science.

Suchata's foray into the world of pageantry began in 2022 when, at just 18 years old, she competed in Miss Universe Thailand, earning the title of third runner-up. She was later elevated to second runner-up following the resignation of Nicolene Limsnukan, the original first runner-up.

In 2024, she returned to the spotlight representing Bangkok in Miss Universe Thailand 2024, sweeping several special awards including Miss Charming Talent and Miss Beauty and Confidence. Her poise, eloquence, and charisma ultimately earned her the national crown.

Suchata went on to represent Thailand at Miss Universe 2024 in Mexico City, where she placed as third runner-up and also won the Voice for Change – Silver Award, further showcasing her commitment to meaningful advocacy.

However, her journey took a dramatic turn in April 2025, when the Miss Universe Organization revoked her third runner-up placement due to her acceptance of another title before completing her 12-month reign.

While controversial, this move paved the way for her next groundbreaking achievement.

On April 22, 2025, Suchata was officially appointed as Thailand's representative to Miss World 2025 by the Miss World Thailand Organization, a joint initiative of Tero Entertainment and TPN Global. Demonstrating her digital savvy and social impact, she won the Multimedia Challenge, securing her place in the Top 40 finalists.

Her final performance in Hyderabad on May 31 was nothing short of mesmerizing. Through her advocacy, charm, and global vision, Suchata stood out among a field of accomplished women — ultimately ts of millions.

Her victory is not only a personal triumph but also a historic milestone for Thailand, inspiring young women nationwide to dream big and lead with purpose.

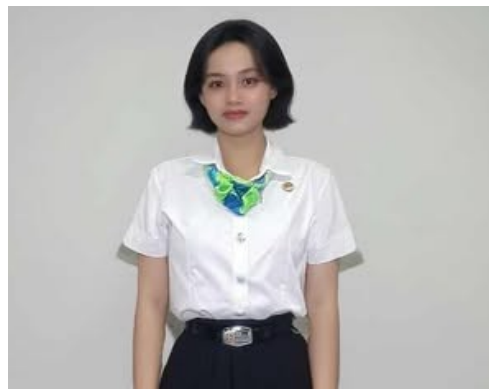
Monthira Kitham

AIRLINE BUSINESS STUDENTS' TRAVEL EXPERIENCE IN HONG KONG

From May 19 to 21, 2025, I had the opportunity to travel to Hong Kong with Emirates Airlines. This trip was a valuable and eye-opening experience, particularly in observing the cultural, lifestyle, and transportation differences between Thailand and Hong Kong. I learned that Hong Kong is one hour ahead of Thailand and had the chance to explore local beliefs, traditions, and the deep-rooted influence of deities and feng shui in everyday life. I also discovered various locations throughout the city that are believed to radiate positive energy.

Day 1: Arrival and First Impressions

Upon arriving in Hong Kong, our first destination was the iconic Victoria Harbour to watch the light and sound show. This spot is a must-see for visitors, offering stunning views both day and night. After the show, we checked in at our hotel, the Damara HKG Grand. For our first meal, we tried noodle soup at a nearby restaurant — it was quite delicious. What made the experience special was the shop owner greeting

us in Thai with a cheerful “Sawasdee krub,” which made us feel especially welcome. Later that evening, we took a short walk around the hotel neighborhood before heading back to rest.

Day 2: Disneyland Adventure

Our second day presented us with two options: visiting temples and taking a scenic cable car ride, or spending the day at Hong Kong Disneyland. Naturally, as young and energetic students, we chose Disneyland! We managed everything on our own, from purchasing tickets online to navigating the MTR (Mass Transit Railway), which felt very similar to Bangkok’s BTS. The Disneyland ticket cost was around HKD 2,800 per person, and the round-trip train fare was about HKD 50.

It was our first time visiting Disneyland, and the experience was thrilling. We enjoyed several attractions, especially Frozen World and the Iron Man Experience. The most unforgettable moment was the nighttime fireworks show. Although there was a light drizzle in the evening, the rain stopped just in time for the show. The fireworks were absolutely spectacular and well worth the wait — we even heard that the show costs approximately one million Thai baht per night! Afterward, we returned to the hotel, grabbed something to eat, and called it a night.

Day 3: Temple Tour and Cultural Insights

On our final day, we toured five famous temples in Hong Kong. Unfortunately, I can’t recall their names as they were in Chinese. At each temple, we made different types of wishes — most commonly for success, love, career, and financial prosperity. We were accompanied by a Thai tour guide who had lived in

Hong Kong for many years. He expertly guided us through the temple rituals and explained how to properly pay respects to the deities.

As we traveled from temple to temple, I noticed how harmoniously Hong Kong is built around nature. Locals believe that each mountain houses a sleeping dragon, and disturbing these mountains could bring misfortune. This belief plays a key role in conserving the natural landscape. Although Hong Kong is comparable in size to Bangkok, it is impressively green, modern, and highly developed.

After completing our visits, we headed to Hong Kong International Airport for our return flight. We once again flew with Emirates, this time on the massive EK-A380 aircraft, which can carry up to 500 passengers. However, upon arriving back in Thailand, we encountered a slight delay. Fortunately, the matter was resolved, and we all returned home safely, albeit quite exhausted.

The event invited faculty members, staff, and students to participate in this meaningful initiative to help replenish the national blood supply at the Thai Red Cross Society's National Blood Centre.

The campaign was well-organized and professionally managed. Nurses and medical staff were warm, approachable, and

attentive to students throughout the event. The auditorium was neatly arranged, with clearly designated zones to ensure an efficient flow for registration, documentation, and blood testing. During the donation process, nurses carefully monitored the equipment and guided donors at every step, ensuring safety and comfort.

While post-donation symptoms vary among individuals, some donors may experience mild side effects such as fatigue, dizziness, or headaches, which could momentarily affect their ability to resume normal activities. In a few cases, symptoms like nausea or fainting may occur, but these usually subside quickly and without complications.

Despite these temporary effects, blood donation brings significant benefits to both recipients and donors. For recipients, it can mean the gift of life and improved health. For donors, the benefits

include enhanced red blood cell production, a free basic health screening, and a sense of fulfillment from contributing to the well-being of others. Some even report improved skin radiance and a reduced risk of certain illnesses, including cancer.

Ultimately, donating blood is more than just a medical act—it is a compassionate and selfless contribution to society. It reflects a deep sense of social responsibility and human kindness. TRAGEDY STRIKES: AIR INDIA FLIGHT AI171 CRASH CLAIMS

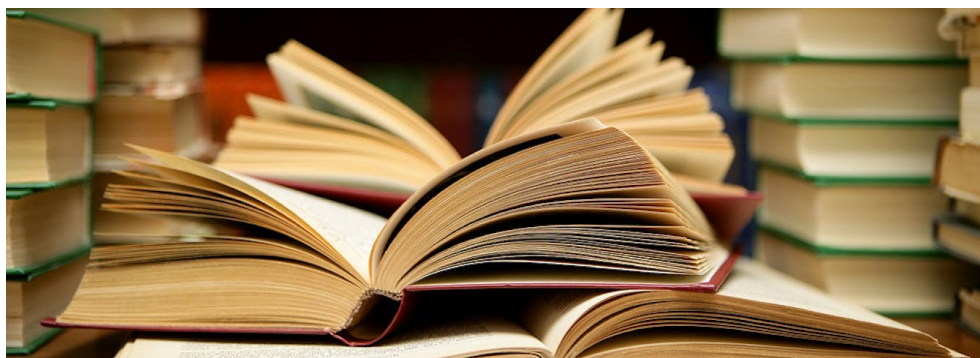

On June 12, 2025, Air India Flight AI171, a Boeing 787 Dreamliner en route to London, tragically crashed just 33 seconds after taking off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport in Ahmedabad. The aircraft struck a residential complex in the Meghaninagar area, triggering a massive explosion and fire. The devastating incident claimed the lives of more than 280 individuals, including all 241 passengers and crew onboard, as well as at least 39 residents on the ground. Miraculously, one passenger survived and remains in critical condition.
