TRAGEDY STRIKES: AIR INDIA FLIGHT AI171 CRASH CLAIMS



Flight AI171, a Boeing 787 Dreamliner Support en route to London, tragically crashed just 33 seconds after taking off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport in Ahmedabad. The aircraft struck a residential complex in the Meghaninagar area, triggering a massive explosion and fire. The devastating incident claimed the lives of more than 280 individuals, including all 241 passengers and crew onboard, as well as at least 39 residents on the ground. Miraculously, one passenger survived and remains in critical condition.
